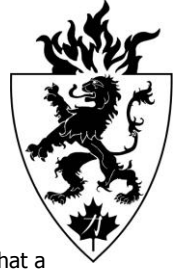


Scholars' Hall ***Student Standards of Good Conduct and Teachability***



Success at Scholars' Hall is contingent upon five assumptions. First, that a student's parents have accurately and completely informed and provided Scholars' Hall with all the information and documentation regarding the student. Second, that a student is intellectually and academically capable of achieving in the appropriate grade level at Scholars' Hall. Third, that a student strives to improve beyond the academic levels identified at admission. Fourth, that a student continues to meet the Standards of Good Conduct and Teachability. Finally, that a student's parents continue to support and promote the philosophies, policies, staff and decisions of Scholars' Hall Inc.

Some of the indicators of a student's and parents' continuing desire of success at Scholars' Hall is adherence to the following Standards of Good Conduct and Teachability...

- **Respect for Self** – a student will . . .
 - be clean, neat and presentable; wearing the full school uniform properly at all times;
 - have acceptable grooming, good personal hygiene and corporal sanctity;
 - will display a positive and optimistic attitude.

- **Respect for Adults** – a student will . . .
 - interact positively with all adults, including school personnel and parents, in the classroom, in the halls, on the property, and out in public;
 - comply with the authority of the school;
 - comply with the school's Student Order and Discipline Policy and the consequences of rules not followed;
 - adhere to the rules of the school and to the laws of the state.

- **Respect for Peers** – a student will . . .
 - respect the rights and freedom of others and their general ability to benefit from Scholars' Hall;
 - interact positively with all peers respecting their right of privacy, personal property, physical and emotional security, in the classroom, in the halls, on the property, and out in public;
 - at all times will speak well of fellow students, welcome others into groups, provide assistance to others when needed, encourage others to join activities;
 - have a positive influence upon other's attitudes and efforts.

- **Concern for Community** – a student will . . .
 - positively and publicly promote the good will and reputation of Scholars' Hall
 - be a law abiding citizen
 - respect all public and private property
 - be a steward of the school's property and building keeping it clean and free of damage;
 - pick up after others and clean up after him/herself;
 - participate in school fund raisers for the benefit of the school community, the local community, the environment, and the world.

- **Maintaining or Improving Academic Effort and Performance** – a student will . . .
 - apply him/herself in each class and will maintain an academic performance equal to or better than his/her assessed abilities.
 - demonstrate a daily commitment to achieve to one's potential
 - will maintain excellent attendance and punctuality;
 - compete all class work, assignments, projects, and homework in a timely fashion and with due diligence.

- **Leadership** – a student will . . .
 - be honest and trustworthy;
 - be a consistent and willing participant;
 - come to the aid of another;
 - be a visible example to others of good citizenship.

At Scholars' Hall every student can earn "Scholar-of-the-Month"!

On the first day of each new month, every Scholars' Hall student returns to his/her "Student-in-Good-Standing" status.

A student will immediately disqualify him/herself from being a "Student in Good Standing" or from being considered for "Scholar of the Month" as a result of earning an office trip; by being absent the equivalent of 4 or more days in a month; by being late for a class 4 or more times in a month; or for earning 9 or more homework strikes in a month.

At the end of every month all the students will be evaluated according to six criteria of the Standards of Good Conduct and Teachability. As a result of this monthly evaluation, every student has an opportunity to become a "Scholar of the Month" or maintain their "Student in Good Standing" status. A student who earns "Scholar of the Month" twice from September to December and/or twice from January to May will be invited to attend an "all you can eat Chinese Buffet" as a guest of Scholars' Hall. Two acknowledgements of "Student in Good Standing" equal one "Scholar of the Month".
